

The Second Australian Go Championship will be held at Burgmann College, Australian National University, Canberra on the 1st and 2nd of September, 1979 (commencing 9 a.m.).

All Go Players, irrespective of nationality are eligible to compete. The winner of the championship will receive the title "Australian Open Go Champion 1979."

The highest placed Australian player will receive the title "Australian Go Champion 1979."

In addition, from those players who compete, an Australian citizen will be selected to represent Australia in the Second World Amateur Go Championship to be held in Tokyo from 25th to 29th March, 1980. The player selected will travel to Japan as a guest of Japan Air Lines. The conditions for selection of the representative are attached.

The rules under which the championship will be played are contained in the "First World Amateur Go Championship Rules." A limited number of copies of these rules are available from:—

PROPOSED CONDITIONS FOR SELECTION OF REPRESENTATIVE FOR WORLD AMATEUR GO CHAMPIONSHIP

1. The player to represent Australia will be selected by the Australian Go Association and will represent Australia on behalf of the Australian Go Association.
2. The player selected will be current Australian Go Champion provided that the player
(a) is willing and able to travel and compete in the competition.
(b) satisfies all conditions herein specified.
3. If the current Australian Go Champion does not satisfy all conditions for selection, then the highest placed Australian player at the Australian Championship who satisfies all conditions will be selected.
4. The player selected must be an Australian citizen at the date of the Australian Go Championship at which he is selected.
5. Except in special circumstances, a player can only be selected once in any three consecutive calendar years.
6. The player selected must be an active member of an Australian Go Club.

CONDITIONS FOR SELECTION OF OCEANIA TEAM CAPTAIN FOR WORLD AMATEUR GO CHAMPIONSHIP

When the rules and conditions of the World Amateur Go Championship allow Australia to select the team captain, then rules 1, 5 and 6 above also apply in the selection of the team captain.
