This year will be the first in which the Australian Champion will get to take home, for one year, a perpetual trophy. As well as determining the Australian and Australian Open Champions, this tournament is used to choose our representative for the World Amateur Championships, to be held next year in April in Nagoya. If you might be in line for the Australian Championship and the representatives position, you should be able to prove your Australian citizenship (a passport, birth certificate, or naturalization papers would be appropriate).

The 1988 annual general meeting will also be held during the tournament, so if you want to run for office, or just let us have your views on the running of the association, be there.

CHINA-JAPAN SUPER GO

The fourth Super Go match has seen an amazing run by the Japanese number 7 player Yoda. He has defeated but China's number 1 Nieh Wei Ping to give Japan a 6-nil lead. This gives China's 'iron goalkeeper' the almost impossible task of beating Yoda, Awaji, Hane, Shiraishi, Ohira, Yamashiro and Takemiya to preserve China's record in these matches. It must be remembered, however, that Nieh did win 5 in a row in the first match.

FUJITSU 'WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP'

In the quarter finals on June 4th, Nieh beat Kato, Rin beat Cho, Kobayashi beat Shiraishi, and Takemiya beat Ma. The semifinals on 2nd July saw 'Sumo' Rin beat the favourite Nieh, while 'Spaceman' Takemiya gained some revenge against the man who demolished him in the last Kisei, Kobayashi. In early September Rin and Takemiya should produce an interesting clash of styles.

IBM HAYAGO OPEN

IBM has entered the Go sponsoring game with this new tournament. A qualifying round on June 6 featured 37 professionals from shodan to 4 dan and 4 amateurs (2 Japanese, 1 American and 1 German). None of the amateurs survived the round.

INTERNATIONAL TENGEN

A new competition matching the Japanese and Chinese Tengen title holders in a three game match has been instituted. The first such match was held on June 20/21 and was a 2-0 win for Cho over Liao.

Takemiya's title is in the balance. The match with Otake stands at 3-3 with the deciding game scheduled for late July.

MEIJIN LEAGUE

A close looking league has Cho in front with 5-2, followed by Rin and Kobayashi on 4-1 and Fujisawa Shuko o 4-2. Shuko's return to the leading ranks included a win over Cho.


